
Objective – The objective of celebrating the National Panchayati Raj Day is to increase awareness about 9 sustainability goals in rural areas.




- Theme 1: Poverty free and enhanced livelihoods village

- Theme 9: Engendered Development in village






















10. PUNE BINNALE 2015, Participation, Associated with Pune Municipal Corporation, Pune



Nikhil Karoshi, Junk artist who is participating for the second time in the art festival, will be showcasing his work which he created all by himself in a span of four days. "Keeping the theme of Migration." To Be And Not To Be, I have created a boat with humans in It out of discarded metal parts." The installation which is II if tall and 12x1 3s qf it indiameter, has been created by selection and accumulation of various discarded metal parts." says Rarosh! Takking about the challenges of creating a junk sculpture, he says that creating a human anatomy is the most difficult part as the features have to be created with precision by both selecting the right size and shape of material and placing them in the right way. "We begin by skerching on paper and later recreate the same in the form of a sculpture. We always do not get the right size or shape of the metal piece, I often have no created different parts of a sculpture separatedly by welding and moulding them and later bringing them all together to create the entire piece. To be a junk artist, one not only needs to think creatively but also needs t know nuances like welding, heating, melting and moulding metal."
